

# Cleaning & Care Instructions

## CABINETS & MIRRORS

For the best results when caring for your PARISI products, follow the instructions carefully and use only the cleaning products suggested below. The use of other cleaning products may damage or discolor your product and potentially affect the functionality.

Always test the cleaning solution on an inconspicuous area before applying to the entire surface. Wipe surfaces clean and rinse completely with water immediately after applying cleaner.

### CABINETS

To maintain the finish on your cabinet, use a soft microfibre cloth and mild non-abrasive solution or detergent.

To remove scratches and marks from polyurethane material, rub gently with car cutting compound, car polish or household brass/silver cleaner.

Be aware that goods used in construction of the premium Multi-wood cabinet joinery are water/moisture resistant, but not water-proof, therefore all cabinets should be installed at least 150mm away from any object, shower or bath to avoid water damage.

### MIRRORS

Mirrors can very easily build up gunk, dust or grime. Mirrors in bathrooms, especially, tend to accumulate an unsightly layer of toothpaste, hairspray, or other bathroom products. This can be even worse if you have hard water that causes Calcium or lime to build up. To preserve the appearance and longevity of your bathroom mirrors, simply follow the steps below:

- ① To clean the mirror and/or mirror doors from any marks (toothpaste, cosmetics, etc), use a soft microfibre cloth, lint-free cloth or chamois leather that has been rinsed in warm water and wrung out well, and gently buff with a clean, dry cloth.
- ② Do not use glass or window cleaner or any other chemicals, as they may damage the silver coating and cause brown marks or black-spotting.
- ③ Keep your mirror dry and wipe off any water, moisture or steam.

### Protection against “black-spotting”

Alkaline, acid and moisture elements can cause the silvered backing of a mirror to darken, this is usually referred to as “black-spotting”.

This will act as a seal to protect against such elements. Always remember to keep your mirror dry and wipe off any water, moisture or steam.

### What to avoid

Do not use Ammonia-based products, bleach or other harsh chemicals. These may erode the mirror’s silver backing and cause brown markings or black-spotting. Be sure to read the label of any such cleaning products before use.

It is the responsibility of the purchaser to ensure the product is installed and maintained appropriately according to manufacturer’s recommendations. Failure to do so may void product warranty.
